These training sessions align with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and cover important topics such as social responsibility, inclusion, diversity, and ethical governance. The training program is designed in accordance with the university's sustainability strategy, aiming to enhance the professional development of both academic and administrative staff. The courses are conducted in an offline format, and include training sessions, round tables, seminars, and webinars. Below are some of the key activities shared during these training sessions:

Round Table on Sustainable Development Goals

Organized by the Sustainable Development Research Center, a round table was held for first-year PhD students, introducing them to the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and how to incorporate SDG keywords in their academic publications.

During the round table, the Director of the Sustainable Development Research Center, T. Gaipov, highlighted the center's goals.

The SDGs are internationally recognized objectives aimed at eradicating poverty, combating inequality and injustice, protecting the planet, and ensuring peace and prosperity for all people. Seventeen primary goals were selected for achievement by 2030, which will lead to sustainable development in all sectors of life and contribute to solving global challenges affecting everyone. The director also emphasized the importance of PhD students linking their dissertations and research papers to the SDGs and incorporating relevant keywords in their academic work.
